According to the Ministry of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce issued the scales measure the percentage of starch in the root 2554 dated 30 December 2554 to allow trading head. Fresh cassava is fair to farmers to calculate the price of fresh cassava roots. Already

For fresh cassava growers to be fair in price calculation, or Fresh cassava And in line with the situation in the trading or distribution of fresh tapioca roots. By virtue of Section 5 and Section 10 of the Measurement Scale Act, BE 2542 (1999), as amended by the Weighing Scales Act (No. 3), BE 2557 and Section 25, paragraph two Of the Weighing Scale Act, BE 2542 (1999) by the Minister of Commerce, upon the advice of the Weights Committee. The announcement is made as follows.

Clause 1. This notification shall come into force after 60 days from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.

Clause 2. The notification of the Ministry of Commerce regarding the use of scales to measure the percentage of starch. In the head of 2011, dated December 30, 2011

Clause 3. The business operator trading fresh tapioca in all areas. All over the kingdom The percentage of starch in the starch must be measured by using a percentage of starch in the cassava traded in fresh cassava roots.

The use of scales to measure the percentage of starch in the head under paragraph one A proportional scale of starch in certified beverages shall be used from the competent official of the central office. Or branch office

Clause 4. Whilst weighing the percentage of starch in the beans for trading or distribution, a scale measuring the starch content of the starch must be provided in such a way that the person concerned is weighed. All parties can see clearly the percentage of starch in their heads.

Clause 5. Whoever does not use the metric weights shall measure the percentage of starch. In the head of trading fresh cassava roots. Shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand Baht under Section 67 Of the Weighing Scale Act BE 2542, as amended by the Weighing Scale Act (No. 3) BE 2557 and in the case of not using a scales to measure the percentage of starch in the bean for sale or distribution of tapioca. Fresh cassava under Clause 3 or violation of Clause 4 of this Announcement shall be liable to imprisonment No more than six months Or a fine of up to twenty thousand baht Or both under Section 70 of the Act Weighing Scale, 1999, as amended by the Weighing Scale Act (No. 3), 2014.
