Conditions Imposed by the Committee

A person who has received the Letter of Permission shall comply with
the following conditions:-

1. shall use a rice weighing machine and a rice moisture analyzer which are
verified by the Department of Internal Trade under the law governing
measurement, shall not use or not have the weighing machine and
the moisture analyzer which has accuracy exceeding the specified
maximum permissible errors, and shall not adjust the weighing machine
and the moisture analyzer which have been verified to display weight and
quantity to deviate from those which have been inspected for accuracy
2. shall not take advantage over farmers in trading, weighing, deduction of
moisture weight, deduction of impurities,
3. shall not adulterate rice,
4. shall strictly comply with official regulations concerning rice trading.

instructions on the back

Instructions

1. The Letter of Permission for Operating Rice Trading must be stuck on the open place where it may be easily seen at the place of operating rice trading. Failure to do so results in punishment with a fine not exceeding one thousand baht or an imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both.

2. A person who has received the Letter of Permission must comply with statements and conditions as specified in the Letter of Permission, otherwise he/she shall be punished with a fine not exceeding five thousand baht or an imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or both. And the Letter of Permission will be withdrawn.

3. When this Letter of Permission expires, if the person who has received the Letter of Permission wishes to continue to operate the rice trading, he/she is required to submit the Form of Notifying Renewal of Letter of Permission prior to the expiry date and also bring this Letter of Permission.

4. This Letter of Permission is exclusive and not transferable. And upon discontinuation of the operation of rice trading, he/she is required to notify the Committee or a competent official of such matter (this Letter of Permission will also be returned to the competent official), otherwise he/she shall be punished with a fine not exceeding one thousand baht or an imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both.
